Yes and he will also frown when the new Staff Regulations enters into force because he is in the same boat.

Is it really useful to strike? will it achieve anything?

It is a strong signal that the Staff won't accept punitive decisions. Not striking is giving a free rein to whoever wants to harm the European Civil Service.
